Rated as "High Performing" by the NJDOE and a finalist for the National School Change Award for two consecutive years, students have the opportunity for many cultural and educational experiences because of the abundance of resources available in our community. Boonton School District is comprised of two municipalities, the towns of Boonton and Lincoln Park. With a combined population of approximately 20,000, both communities are located about 35 miles west of New York City.

CURRICULUM

The curriculum accommodates the diverse needs, abilities, and interests of a multi-cultural student body. Students are offered Advanced Placement, Dual Credit, Honors, as well as vocational and technical courses in a traditional schedule to support the 130 credits required for graduation. Accredited by the State of New Jersey and the Middle States Association, the high school has earned a reputation for preparing students for the most competitive colleges, universities, and the job market. In addition, the school also provides an extensive extra-curricular program, including fine arts, sports, international travel programs, and an outstanding student government organization.

GATEWAY ACADEMY

Raising the level of expectations, we offer gifted and academically talented students the opportunity to be part of the Gateway Academy. Qualified pupils participate in mentoring programs and enrichment projects. They are also required to take a combination of 8 Advanced Placement & Dual Credit classes, allowing them to earn college credits and graduate with 145 credits, as opposed to New Jersey's 120 credit requirement. Successful participation in the Gateway Academy will culminate in an independent senior honors thesis project which is a capstone project to graduate with Gateway Academy Scholar Honors.

DUAL CREDIT/ADVANCED PLACEMENT/HONORS

Boonton High School affords students the opportunity to earn high school and college credit while taking college level courses at the high school. Advanced Placement and Honors level courses are offered throughout the curriculum to meet the varied abilities of our students.

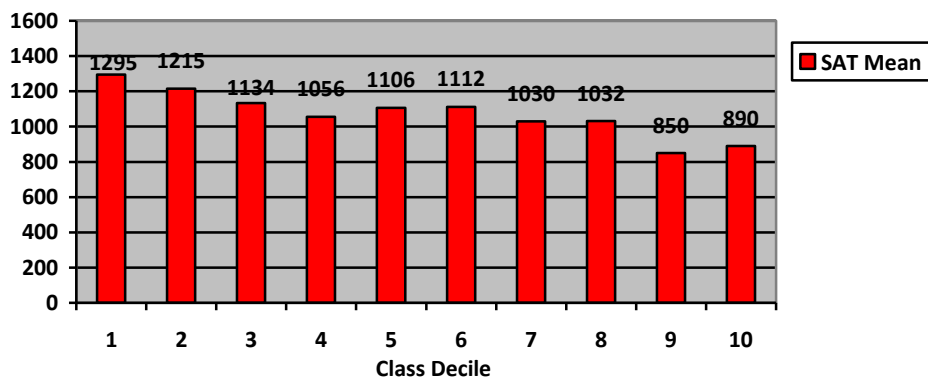
