

- The multi-week program consists of hundreds of opportunities for students to learn about the college search process and about many different colleges through panel presentations and information sessions.
- Students should participate live so they can ask questions and interact with the college admission counselors. If students are unable to attend live, we still encourage them to register for the sessions they are interested in and recordings will be available on the NJACAC website later.
- Students will gain a wealth of college knowledge, get exposure to a variety of colleges, and have the opportunity to ask questions of admission counselors, all in a safe, flexible, online environment.

## Student Registration

- Students should register for *each session* that they want to attend. Once they register, they will receive a confirmation email with their unique link to join the Zoom webinar.
- (Students will also receive a barcode, but the barcode is not necessary for this virtual event.) When students register, they are sharing their registration information *only with* colleges presenting on that particular panel. StriveScan *does not* sell or share personally identifiable student information with any other third parties.



## **COVID Considerations & Testing**


- COVID-19 has changed the standardized testing landscape for the 2020-21 school year.
  - Much uncertainty remains.
  - It is important to stay on top of pandemic-related shifts in both SAT/ACT test dates and test-optional policies at colleges.
- Seniors who are entering the college application process should try to sit for the SAT or ACT exam, but should also be aware of **constantly-evolving test-optional policies** at their prospective colleges.
- The College Board did add an additional SAT test date in September and the ACT added several additional test dates in September and October.
  - Seniors who wish to sit for the test for the first time (due to previous cancellations), or improve on an earlier score can register for that date.
  - Whether the test gets administered is, of course, entirely dependent on the state of the virus at that time.

ACT Academy is a free online learning tool that includes test practice resources designed to help students master the skills they need to improve their ACT scores and succeed in college and career.

#### Here's how it works:

- 1. Create an account @ act.org/academy
- Explore resources for K-12 subjects or for ACT prep
- Take quizzes on targeted subjects to test your knowledge. An official ACT practice test is also included.
- 4. Track your scores and practice on the areas you need help in
- 4. Check in daily and follow the recommended steps for improvement

### SAT/ACT/TEST OPTIONAL

- Some colleges do not require applicants to report their SAT or ACT scores for admission.
  - Click here for a complete list of: Test-Optional Colleges
- These schools reference the student's academic performance and accomplishments in high school.
- This includes a student's GPA, rigor of courses taken, courses taken above the state requirements, and extracurricular activity sheet/resume.
- However, those colleges may require tests scores in order for the student to be considered for scholarships or honors programs.

#### **APPLICATION DEADLINES**

- Early Decision:
  - Applications due by November 1
  - If accepted, student MUST attend
  - Can only apply to 1 school Early Decision
- Early Action:
  - Applications due by November 1 or November 15
  - Find out earlier whether accepted or not
- Regular Decision
  - Receive admissions decision by April 1
  - Application deadline is different for each college but usually from December - February
- Rolling Admissions
  - Longer timeline to submit application and faster turnaround

#### **COMMON APP & COALITION**

- Students create one application
- The single application is accepted at various colleges
- Some colleges require a supplemental application in addition to the Common App or Coalition



# FREE College Essay Review Opportunity

- 1. Anyone in the process of applying to colleges can participate in this program, pending parent/guardian approval.
- 2. Students can send in their Common Application essay as well as resumes only. At this time, we will not be reviewing supplementary essays.
- 3. Documents can be submitted through a provided google form
- 4. Essays should be submitted in Microsoft Word document so that comments can be made and sent back to the respective student.
- 5. Because no changes will be made to the document directly, all comments should be applied at the discretion of the student. Our organization cannot be held responsible for the final published product.
- 6. Our estimated turnaround time is 2 weeks, but this cannot be guaranteed depending on the volume of submissions. Please be patient as we are working on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- 7. Our goal is to have a positive impact on the community. If the school has specific rules or regulations that need to be abided by, we are more than happy to adjust and accommodate in any way possible.

### **INSTANT DECISION DAYS (IDD)**

- Local Colleges and Universities
  - Same Application process
  - Colleges usually waive the application fee
- Onsite Interview
  - Dress appropriately
  - Instant decision (accepted or not) on the spot
    - If accepted, do not need to commit
  - Scholarship Decision
    - Offered on the spot
    - If scholarship is given, school will provide a range
    - Range of money offered based on MERIT
